New Investment in AV at the STC



The STC has a newly installed AV and Video Conferencing system, providing the following:

- 6 x audio Headsets for faculty use during demonstrations. This can also be used for intra faculty communication.
- Each of the 7 stations has HDMI and DVI inputs for compatible devices such as microscopes, C-Arms, surgical robots, etc.
- Each of the 7 stations also has a 4K endoscope and an overhead camera. 2 portable POV 4K cameras can be mounted to any station.
- Each of the 7 stations has a bench screen which can display footage from any of the inputs.
- Ceiling-mounted Pan Tilt Zoom 4K camera that can capture the whole lab but also can zoom in to a particular station.
- PEARL system that can record synchronised footage from up to 6 inputs. These are uploaded to our secure cloud storage, can be edited and made available to faculty (and candidates) after the course.
- 30-seat seminar room with an 87 inch LCD screen and CISCO video conferencing system.
- Live footage from the lab can be streamed to the seminar room and/or to a MS Teams meeting for remote candidates or faculty.


Throughout the year we have ran 66 courses with over 1000 people improving their surgical skills and knowledge.

CBCT Scanning



It's a pleasure for us to announce that we can now provide our dental and maxilla facial clients with pre-course CBCT scanning of donor Cephalus tissue.

To enable the planning, the tissue will be ordered in advance and CBCT scans performed upon arrival at the centre and stored until your course date.

During the planning process of your unique course, we will discuss how early the tissue will be required to allow for CBCT scanning. Recent experience shows that 3 weeks is usually suitable, however it can be extended if you require implants to be made.

These scans will be provided to you electronically in a DICON format. We will use the donor ID number as the reference for your scan and relate this to the donor station on the day of your course.

'I thought I would fill you in on the positive outcome of the below patient. Maria was lead surgeon for her operation to remove a large skin tumour from her shoulder and subsequently coordinated the reconstruction of her defect, so all credit should go to her.

For my small part, I'm sure I speak for us both when I say the ability to work with the West Midlands Surgical Training Centre contributed considerably to the positive outcome of this patient. The tumour was complex and the anatomy unusual. The ability to explore the area surgically, in advance, in the West Midlands Surgical Training Centre aided the operation considerably. An improved familiarity with the local anatomy reduced decision making in theatre and allowed pre-visualization of the problem and surgical approach. My thanks to the WMSTC team'
